It is important that you place your fence, wall or hedge on your own property so as not to encroach on your neighbors or the public's property. The best way to determine where your property line is to have a land surveyor locate your property pins. However, the following may be of help in determining where your property line is:

Streets in Hailey are 60, 70, 80, 90, or 100 feet in width. The asphalt is placed approximately in the center of this right of way. Measuring 30, 35, 40, 45, or 50 feet respectively from the centerline of the street will put you in the vicinity of your property line.

Property pins are quite often buried underground and can be located with a metal detector. Typically property pins are pieces of deformed steel with a yellow cap on the top driven into the ground at the point where your property adjoins other properties forming a corner (change in direction).

Please have the following checklist completed prior to submitting your application for a fence permit.

1. Have you accurately located your property pins? Yes ___ No ___
2. What is the width of the street right of way? _____
3. What is the front yard setback? _____

Note: Fences can be no more than 4 feet tall in the front yard setback and no more than 6 feet tall in the side and rear yard setback. Fence height shall be measured from record grade.
