The 1937 Hailey Masonic Lodge is the work of John M. “Jack” Rutter, a local builder who was responsible for the construction of many commercial and institutional buildings and residences in Hailey and southern Idaho during a career that spanned more than seventy years. The building is also significant for its association with the local Masonic lodge, one of the oldest lodges still extant in Idaho. Located at the southeast corner of the intersection of Bullion Street & Second Ave South. A large wood framed sign is at the left of the walk leading to the building, and a lamp post is located to the right, with two spruce trees flanking them and mature maple trees along the Bullion sidewalk
