



130 years ago this July

On July 6, 1881, the Wood River Times reported that a comet continued to be the topic of discussion around Hailey. Its position was ever changing and many people were fearful that its presence signaled the end of the world. Professor Simon Newcomb was interviewed by the paper and dispelled the concerns afflicting the city stating, "This fear of comets is a delusion, I know, as prevalent as it is difficult to disabuse people of. Why no harm would come probably from running into any number of comets."

Landscaping

Do your Aspen trees have borers?

Signs that you could have a pesky borer:

- A wet spot on the trunk. It kind of looks like your tree is "bleeding". Follow the sap and it will probably lead you to a small hole in the trunk.
- Look at the base of your Aspen tree. If there is a pile of wood shavings, this is the sign of a borer.

The most common Aspen borer is "Saperda calcarata" also called Poplar borer. The adult beetle lays her eggs in the Aspen trunk and it's actually the larvae doing the damage. The larvae can live up to three years in the trunk and keeps tunneling deeper and deeper in to the heartwood and sapwood of the tree. This will weaken the tree more and more. Borers are hard to fight, so if you're trying to save the tree, the best option is to call a certified arborist. An arborist can assess the damage and come up with a treatment plan.

Woodside Blvd Project

Council approves Woodside final design improvements

Hailey City Council approved the final bid package for the Woodside Boulevard Improvements Project at a June 27 public hearing. This means all engineering and design of the road is complete; and public input about what the roadway looks like - including elements such as sidewalks, bike lanes, on-street parking and landscaping - have been considered and incorporated into the project design.

A completed bid package also means the project is ready for contractors to bid pricing on it for construction. Construction is scheduled to begin in late summer/early fall on the new traffic signal at the intersection of Woodside and SH-75. Remaining work will be performed in 2012 and 2013.


The city and project team extends its thanks to the many residents and Woodside users who have participated in public meetings, Council hearings and individual conversations to help shape what Woodside Boulevard will look like. Citizen input has greatly influenced the final design.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

2011 Construct traffic signal at the intersection of Woodside Boulevard and SH-75.


2012 Construct roundabout at the intersection of Woodside and Fox Acres, Woodside roadway resurfacing/rehabilitation and corridor improvements between Fox Acres and Countryside (these improvements include sidewalks, bike lanes, curb/gutter, landscape zone).

2013 Construct corridor improvements between Countryside and SH-75 (these improvements include sidewalks, bike lanes, curb/gutter, landscape zone).

design and build bike racks that will be installed at nine transit stops as part of the Woodside Boulevard Improvements Project. The bike rack project is funded by Hailey's Percent for Public Art Program.

Three of the bike racks will be fabricated and temporarily installed downtown this summer. These three racks will be moved to their permanent home on Woodside as construction phases are completed in 2012 and 2013.
