Woodside Boulevard Update

The Woodside Boulevard Project is moving forward and construction is scheduled to begin this spring. While the project remains essentially the same, the schedule has changed significantly – most notably, the project will be constructed in its entirety this year. Schedule milestones include the following:

Jan/Feb 2012 – Bid Package. A package will be issued for contractors to bid pricing on construction costs.

Feb 2012 – Contractor/Bid Selection.

Mar 2012 – Citizen Meeting. The city will host a meeting to provide construction information and schedule, potential driveway impacts, and introduce the contractor. The purpose of the meeting will be to answer final questions about detours and access, and allow the contractor to address concerns.

Apr-Nov 2012 – Construction for Entire Woodside Project

- Woodside Boulevard roadway resurfacing/rehabilitation
- Corridor improvements to include sidewalks, bike lanes, curb/gutter, landscape zones, pocket parking in some areas and mailbox banks on each block
- Roundabout at the intersection of Woodside and Fox Acres
- Traffic signal at SH-75 and Woodside intersection

NEW Home and Business Energy Audit and Retrofit Rebates

Starting January 15th, the Hailey Save-A-Watt program will be open to applicants who have a home or commercial building in Hailey. As part of the Hailey Community Climate Challenge, the program offers a limited number of funds to Hailey applicants who get an energy audit and complete at least one energy efficiency retrofit.

Homes qualify for two local rebate programs: Version 2.0 Community Audit and Retrofit Rebate Program (CARRP v2.0) and Hailey Save-A-Watt. Applicants applying for both programs may be eligible to receive a rebate for 100% of the labor and 80% of the eligible material and equipment expenses, up to \$4000 total. Commercial buildings qualify for Hailey Save-A-Watt only. (See table on page 2 for more information).


In addition to these two local programs, other rebates from Idaho Power and tax credits and deductions from the state and federal government can also be applied for qualifying energy efficiency work. Previous CARRP applicants (Version 1.0) are eligible to apply under CARRP v2.0 and do not need to get another energy audit.

All applicants must attend one of the free quarterly energy efficiency workshops, which are open to the public and offered by the Hailey Community Climate Challenge, prior to receiving their rebate. The first workshop will be offered on January 26th, 6-7:30pm in the Hailey Public Library. In addition, a renewable energy workshop on solar, geothermal, and wind will be offered on Feb. 9th, 6-7:30pm in the Hailey Public Library. (Continue on Pg. 2)
