Hailey's 4th of July Parade Honors Bowe Bergdahl

The Hailey Independence Day Parade begins at noon on Hailey's Main Street. This year, as Bowe Bergdahl remains in captivity for three full years, the Hailey Chamber of Commerce has named Bowe the honorary grand marshal of the parade. This show of support comes from Bowe's hometown for one of its own sons, held as a prisoner of war, and for continued support of the Bergdahl family. Sun Valley Auto Club will provide a classic yellow thunderbird, which will be driven by Bowe's stand-in. The car will carry two other former prisoners of war.

Call For Photos and Stories!

It's time for the new Martyn Mallory's of Hailey to come forward and supplement the historical record of our community. Martyn did an amazing job of documenting people, places and things in and around Hailey from the late 1800's to 1936. What is needed now is to make sure that the historical record of our town continues up to the present. Look through your old family albums and find the photos that show Hailey from the 1940's to the present.

What?: Look through your family photo albums for pictures, slides, or digital images that show recognizable features of Hailey or the surroundings. The subject of the photos may have been people, and that's great, as long as there are recognizable details (buildings, rivers, lakes, mountains, etc.) in the background. Once you've located any photos that add to the historical record please do the following:

- Write a short documentation of the photograph that includes a) the approximate date, or exact if known, of the photo, b) where the photo was taken, c) identity of any people in the photo, d) any story that might provide interesting details about the photo.

- Include your name and address so that your family photo/slide can be returned.
- **Any photos or slides will be scanned and returned in their original condition!**

When?: Any time over the next 12 months

Where?: The historical record compiled from the photos will be archived and stored at Hailey City Hall by the Hailey Historic Preservation Commission.

As Hailey celebrates its 131st year, together we can ensure that our community's stories will be preserved for future generations.
