## Community Services - Hailey Library **Electronic Resources & Research Databases available at Hailey Library**

The Hailey Public Library provides the following research databases for the use of our patrons. You can come in to the library and use them on our public computers, or access them from your home computer by using your library account number and the last four digits of your phone number.

**EBSCO HOST: Premium online information resource for institutions world-wide.** As a Web searcher, it is often very challenging to distinguish between quality content and less-than-credible information when sifting through long lists of search results. To alleviate this burden, public libraries, universities and other research facilities invest in quality databases that provide the best possible content for their users, such as those offered on *EBSCOhost*.



**LiLI.org: A collection of academic and general interest research databases, funded by LiLI.** Includes **Auto Repair Reference Center**, and **Heritage Quest Online**.



The LiLI Databases (LiLI-D) are online services providing full-text articles from magazines, professional journals, newspapers, and reference

books free to all Idaho residents.

## Public Works and Snow Removal **Snow Removal Priorities**

The City of Hailey will emphasize the following priorities in its snow removal practices this winter:

- Main Street snow will be pushed to the center and hauled away.
- Sidewalks along main will be cleaned even during light snowfalls to prevent ice build-up.
- Woodside Sidewalks on the east side will be cleaned even during light snowfalls to provide safe walking conditions.
- Woodside Sidewalks on west side will be cleaned only near Woodside Elementary School. The remainder of the west side will only be cleaned as time permits between storms.

### **DO NOT PARK VEHICLES IN THE CITY'S RIGHT OF WAY OVERNIGHT FROM NOVEMBER-MAY**

The city prefers to plow a night. Park vehicles well out of the way at night. The city issues warning tags on vehicles and trailers parked within the Right of Way when warnings are feasible. However, a tow truck will be called to remove vehicles that impede snow removal. Owners must pay tow company fees associated with storage and towing.

### **DO NOT PLACE YOUR TRASH CONTAINER IN THE RIGHT OF WAY DURING A SNOW EVENT.**


The plow crews try very hard not to hit trash cans left out while they are plowing, but prefer that the cans not impact snow removal. Please keep your trash cans and all personal items back from the roadway during a storm.

### **DO NOT LET YOUR CHILDREN BUILD SNOW CAVES OR SNOW FORTS NEAR THE ROADWAY SNOW BANKS.**

Snow forts can seem like a lot of fun, but they are extremely dangerous when built next to the road. When snow builds up we push the banks back to help with visibility at intersections. We cannot see children playing in these caves.

### **WHEN CLEARING YOUR DRIVE, PUT SNOW INTO YOUR YARD**

Please be considerate of your neighbors. If a neighbors' driveway is next to yours, push or blow the snow into your own yard. Do not push or plow the snow back into the roadway, as it may impede emergency vehicle access. If you are able, help keep sidewalks snow-free!



## How to Recycle After Christmas

### Christmas Tree

- \* Pick up by Clear Creek Disposal (726-9600) - small fee.
- \* Drop off at Park and Ride (corner of River and Bullion St.) in "Tree Only" dumpster—only clean trees, cut into 3 foot lengths, no fee.
- \* Drop off at Ohio Gulch Transfer Station—no fee.
- \* Pick up by WRHS Band tree collection fundraiser, Sat., Jan. 5<sup>th</sup> call Sandra 481-0389 to schedule (\$10-20).

### No Dumping

Please don't leave trees or cardboard by dumpsters or in parks, parking lots or neighboring gulches.

### Wrapping/Gift Paper

With mixed paper at curbside. Can be combined with junk mail, packing paper, cereal boxes, shoe boxes, magazines, newspapers and paper bags. Details: <http://5brecycles.org>
