Irrigation Times Restricted in Hailey

Hailey regulates irrigation for two purposes: water conservation and water pressure stabilization. Daytime irrigation in heat and high sunlight evaporates much of the water and burns grasses and plant leaves.

Hailey's water system holds better pressure and the water storage tanks remain full when irrigation is controlled through odd/even regulations. Because a high water tank level is important for fire-fighting, Hailey enforces its irrigation restrictions which limit the allowed irrigation time periods.

When Can I Water?

- Even numbered addresses water on even numbered days.
- Odd numbered addresses water on odd numbered days.
- Must water before 10:00 a.m. and after 6:00

1st Violation - Door knob hanger with the violation marked

2nd Violation - Written violation letter from the City of Hailey

3rd Violation - Water turn off at the property with no further notice and a \$100 fee to reinstate service.

Noxious Weeds

The City will begin spot-spraying noxious weeds in City right-of-ways with herbicide during the month of July.

Residents who prefer to pull noxious weeds by hand that are in city right-of-ways adjacent to their properties, may do so by notifying the City Parks Division Manager in advance at 788-5965. Weeds should be pulled and placed in bags for disposal in the garbage.

City Street Trees—Know Before you Trim

Trees within city right-of-ways are considered public trees. Trimming or removing them is allowed only with an encroachment permit. Our urban forests are valuable and we want to maintain and enjoy them for many years to come.

Topping of trees is poor practice, and is prohibited on city trees. Careful trimming of trees can improve the health of trees, as well as their form and growth habits.



A request for an encroachment permit to trim healthy trees or trim or remove hazardous trees will be considered promptly by city public works staff.

The permit is designed to guide all projects in the right-of-way, with safety in mind, proper grade and drainage for longer lasting asphalt, and placement so that snow plowing doesn't destroy your finished product. Any grading, planting, curbing, installation of pavers, driveways, berms, or walls are subject to an encroachment permit.



Public Works

Woodside Blvd.—Native Grasses Are Meant to Grow Tall

Please do not mow the landscape strip.



The native fescue grasses in the landscape strip are intended to grow long. This is a drought tolerant grass that needs water for 2-3 years to establish. Mowing too frequently can damage the grass, inhibit growth and cause bare spots.

Mowing also reduces the grasses drought tolerant properties. City of Hailey crews will mow the landscape strip at appropriate intervals for optimal health of the grasses. Typically these types of grasses only need mowing 1-2 times a year.



OTHER WOODSIDE BLVD. INFORMATION

Thank you for irrigating behind the sidewalk.

The areas behind the sidewalk where sod or seed were planted to blend into existing yards should be irrigated. We thank all of those who have made efforts to keep the sod alive during this critically dry year.

Manage yard sale parking and driveway access.

Broken sprinkler heads in the landscape strip occur when motorists miss their driveways and especially when yard sale activity occurs. If you have a yard sale, please block off the landscape strip or put signs out so visitors to the neighborhood don't drive or park on the landscape strip.

Encroachment Permits are required for landscap-

ing, trees, or walls.

Please apply for an Encroachment Permit from the City of Hailey before grading, landscaping, planting trees or shrubs, or erecting walls in the Woodside Blvd. right-of-way. Decorative items placed too close to the sidewalk may be damaged during snow removal operations and may damage expensive snow removal equipment. If the area was disturbed during the Woodside Boulevard project, it is city right-of-way. Please contact us before doing any work in that area.

City irrigation of the landscape strip:

The City of Hailey allows irrigation for establishment of plant materials, outside of the odd-even irrigation schedule established by City Ordinance.

The city recently switched the irrigation schedule to water different parts of the strip every other day between the hours of 6pm and 10am. The entire strip cannot be watered in one day. Different parts will be programmed for either even or odd days.
