

Hailey Fire and Rescue

Mission/Purpose

The City of Hailey has relied on its citizens to protect the city from fire and emergencies since 1884. As a Combination Paid/Volunteer fire department we still heavily rely on citizens to respond as part-time firefighters or EMT's at all hours of the day.



Current Vacancies

The department has many openings available for new volunteer members. No experience is necessary, and all training is provided free of charge. We even pay our "volunteers" for their time spent on emergencies.

Responsibilities and Basic Duties

Men and Women over the age of 18 are encouraged to apply to be a Firefighter. All training costs are paid by the city, and protective clothing provided. This training will provide you with the knowledge to safely respond to fire and life safety emergencies. Students who successfully complete the basic training course are then considered "Paid-Per-Call" employees, and are paid for their training and response to emergencies.



We even have a benefits incentive plan that provides our "volunteer" members with supplemental funding for benefits such as tuition, retirement, childcare or health care insurance.

Library Board

Mission/Background:

The Board of Trustees of the Hailey Public Library exists by virtue of the provisions of Title 33, Chapter 26 of the Idaho Code. The Board exercises the authority and assumes the responsibility delegated to it by said statutes for the provision of public library service in the city of Hailey, Idaho.



Current Vacancies on the Library Board

The Library Board is composed of five Hailey City residents representing a cross section of community interests. Each voting Board appointment is for five years. The term of one Board member shall expire each year in September. There are no vacancies at this time. Please inquire at the library for more information.

Responsibilities and Basic Duties

The basic duties are to oversee the library's budget, to hire, support, and evaluate a qualified director, and to approve policies. In addition to these duties, trustees are legally responsible for assuring that the general operation of the library as well as all board meetings are conducted in accordance with Idaho law. Engaged, knowledgeable trustees can provide leadership and guidance to help even the best library to attain a higher level of excellence.
