State of Idaho Stay Healthy Order Issued

Guidance for Businesses Offered through State Website & Hotlines

(Hailey ID) Governor Brad Little announced today that the State of Idaho's Stay Home Order will expire today. Beginning tomorrow, on Friday May 1, 2020, a new [Idaho Stay Healthy Order](#) will be in effect. The Stay Healthy Order incorporates Stage 1 of Idaho's [Rebound Idaho Plan](#) that was released by the State last week.

The State is relying on local community enforcement agencies to enforce the Stay Healthy Order. The impact that the Stay Healthy Order has on city facilities, parks and events will be discussed during May city council meetings, beginning with a special meeting set for Monday, May 4, 2020. At that meeting, the Hailey City Council will review the plans developed by city administration for reopening parks and facilities. The City Council will hold a preliminary discussion of special events scheduled for mid to late summer, after Rebound Idaho Stage 4 has been reached, which allows gatherings of over 50 people.

In Stage 1, which is made effective on May 1, 2020 through Idaho's Stay Healthy Order, the City of Hailey will continue to monitor, guide and enforce the allowed activities of Stage 1, which include the following categories:

Gatherings, both public and private, should be avoided and individuals should continue to:

- Engage in physical distancing of at least six feet
- Wear face coverings in public places
- Stay home if sick
- Practice good hand hygiene
- Cover coughs and sneezes
- Disinfect surfaces and objects regularly

What businesses and activities may open?

- Day cares may resume activities with proper distancing. Provided here is State guidance for [Daycares](#).

- Places of worship resume activities with proper distancing. Provided here is State guidance for [Places of Worship](#).
- Dine-in restaurants may continue carry-out operations and submit plans to Idaho Public Health District 5 for their reopening within Phase 2. Provided here is the [Idaho Health District Form for Restaurants to Submit Plans](#)

What remains closed?

The following businesses within the State of Idaho are required to remain closed except to perform Minimum Basic Operations, as defined in Section 6:

- a. Bars and nightclubs;
- b. Restaurant dining rooms (takeout and delivery continue to be allowed);
- c. Indoor gyms and recreation facilities;
- d. Close contact services (e.g. hair salons, nail salons, massage parlors, cosmetic, etc.);
- e. Large venues (e.g. movie theatres, concert venues, sporting venues, etc.).

All employers are required to continue to:

- Maintain the six-foot physical distancing requirements for employees and patrons
- Provide adequate sanitation and personal hygiene for employees, vendors, and patrons
- Ensure frequent disinfection of the businesses as well as regular cleaning, especially of high-touch surfaces
- Identify how personal use items such as masks, face coverings, and gloves may be required by employees, vendors, and/or patrons
- Provide services while limiting close interactions with patrons
- Restrict non-essential business travel
- Identify strategies for addressing ill employees, which should include requiring COVID-19 positive employees to stay at home while infectious, and may include keeping employees who were directly exposed to the COVID-19 positive employee away from the workplace, and the closure of the business until the location can be properly disinfected
- On a case-by-case basis, include other practices appropriate for specific types of businesses, such as screening of employees for illness and exposures upon work entry, requiring non-cash transactions, etc.

Travel continues to be restricted, with 14-day quarantine required of travelers coming to Idaho from another state or country:

- a. Persons entering the state of Idaho are required to self-quarantine for 14 days. If an individual will be present in Idaho for fewer than 14 days, that individual must self-quarantine for the duration of their visit. For purposes of clarity, this directive does not apply to persons performing an Essential Purpose or persons who as part of their normal life live in one state and travel to another state for an Essential Purpose.
- b. "Essential Purpose" is interpreted broadly and includes travel required for personal safety; to obtain food, beverage or medicine; for medical care; pursuant to a lawful permit, license, court order, or rule; to care for others; and to perform work, services or functions deemed critical to public health and safety, as well as economic and national security. Travel into the state of Idaho for recreation is not an Essential Purpose.
- c. Any individual required by this directive to self-quarantine shall be responsible for any and all costs associated with the requirement to self-quarantine, including transportation, lodging, food, and medical care.
- d. Persons who have tested positive for COVID-19, are presumptively diagnosed with COVID-19, or are exhibiting symptoms identified in the CDC's screening guidance shall not enter the state of

Idaho unless doing so under medical orders for the purposes of medical care, are being transported by emergency personnel, are being driven directly to a medical provider for purposes of medical care, or are a resident of the state of Idaho.

INDIVIDUAL

- Todos los habitantes de Idaho vulnerables deben continuar en cuarentena. Los miembros de hogares con residentes vulnerables deben ser conscientes de que al regresar al trabajo u otros entornos donde el distanciamiento no siempre es posible, podrían transmitir el virus a sus hogares. Se deben tomar precauciones para aislarse de los residentes vulnerables.
- Deben evitarse las reuniones, tanto públicas como privadas.
- Minimice los viajes no esenciales y cumpla con las pautas de los CDC con respecto al aislamiento después de un viaje.
- Continúe con la cuarentena de 14 días para las personas que ingresan a Idaho para evitar la afluencia de visitantes de otros estados.

EMPLEADOR

Consulte "Tipos específicos de empleadores" en la columna de la derecha para conocer los lugares de culto, restaurantes, bares, gimnasios, guarderías, residencias para ancianos y salones.

- Continúe fomentando el teletrabajo, siempre que sea posible y factible con las operaciones comerciales.
- Haga que los empleados vuelvan a trabajar por etapas, si el distanciamiento físico, la protección personal y el saneamiento son posibles.
- Los empleados que se consideran individuos vulnerables deben continuar en cuarentena. Se deben hacer adaptaciones especiales para estos empleados en el lugar de trabajo si no pueden trabajar desde casa.
- Los comercios no esenciales, además de los excluidos en la orden modificada, implementan planes para reabrir demostrando capacidad para cumplir con los protocolos comerciales.
- Minimice los viajes no esenciales y cumpla con las pautas de los CDC con respecto al aislamiento después de un viaje.

TIPOS ESPECÍFICOS DE EMPLEADORES

- Se prohíben las visitas a instalaciones para personas mayores e instalaciones congregadas (por ejemplo, cárceles y prisiones) y los empleados y proveedores que interactúan con los residentes y pacientes deben cumplir con protocolos estrictos relacionados con la higiene y la prevención de infecciones.
- Los bares y discotecas permanecen cerrados.
- Los comedores de restaurantes permanecen cerrados, desarrollan planes para la reapertura y la capacidad de cumplir con los protocolos comerciales para abrir en la etapa 2.
- Los lugares de culto pueden abrirse si cumplen con el estricto distanciamiento físico, el protocolo de saneamiento y cualquier orientación de los CDC.
- Los gimnasios interiores y las instalaciones recreativas permanecen cerradas, desarrollan planes para la reapertura y la capacidad de cumplir con los protocolos comerciales para abrir en la etapa 2.
- Las peluquerías permanecen cerradas, desarrollan planes para la reapertura y la capacidad de cumplir con los protocolos comerciales para abrir en la etapa 2.
- Las salas grandes (por ejemplo, salas de cine y locales deportivos) están cerradas.
- Se pueden reabrir guarderías y actividades juveniles organizadas y campamentos.
