Programs:

- Four Story Mania programs were offered during the month with a total of sixty-one kids and thirty-three adults in attendance. Nick Quaglia from Blaine County Housing was a guest reader on August 14th. Nick has also volunteered with other library events to help promote a sense of community through the BCHA.
- Four TnT programs were offered with a total of thirty-one in attendance. The book club had a dip in attendance due to the summer break. Three girls attended the discussion.

- Thirty-two people enjoyed a presentation by Sylvie Dore. The topic was fermented foods.
- On a Saturday, the Idaho Trappers Association with the Idaho Fish & Game and the Idaho Chukar Foundation offered a workshop on animal trap avoidance. Ten people were in attendance.

- Distribution of the books at the Blaine County Detention Center began in August. A
 total of six staff hours (LeAnn Gelskey, Nancy Gurney and Cathy Neumann) were
 allocated to the program during two separate sessions. On the first day, approximately
 240 books were taken to the facility and the same amount was weeded from the
 collection. On the second visit, 60 books were taken and again the same amount was
 weeded. Circulation statistics are challenging to gather but the books are circulating. I
 will continue to work on the best way to track usage.
- Corbin Maxey, The Reptile Guy, was another huge hit at the Summer Reading Finale with over 250 kids in attendance! Each child received a book and a lollipop.
- Diane Clark had worked tirelessly to bring author, Craig Johnson, to our library for an
 event. Mr. Johnson was scheduled to speak at the Sun Valley Writer's Conference. Due
 to the fire, the conference was canceled. Mr. Johnson would like to make an
 appearance at our library but it may not be cost effective without him making another
 appearance at another venue.

IcfL:

- Lindsay Kavanagh has been working to get the Books to Go program ready for the upcoming school year. Our community partners include Woodside Elementary, Hailey Elementary, Hemingway Elementary, Head Start and the Advocates. The Commission replaces any lost or damaged books. It's a great way to increase access to print materials for Idaho's children.
- The Public Information Specialist from the Commission submitted a press release on my behalf to the Times News and other local newspapers announcing my completion of the American Library Association's Library Support Staff Certification.

City:

- Nancy Gurney and I have both taken training on the new city software. The conversation from Caselle to Clarity should take place in September.
- I went with the other city department heads on a tour of the fire camp with Chief Chapman. It was very informative and reiterated all that was learned during our emergency training.

Staff:

- On August 16th, I was registered to attend one day of the Pacific Northwest Library Association's conference in Boise. I was able to attend the breakfast and listen to guest speaker, Glenn Olsen, who writes true crime. I also attended one break out session on reading programs for incarcerated inmates before I had to come back home due to the fire situation. Even though my time there was cut short, I found it to be beneficial.
- The library staff was very diligent during the fire to disseminate fire information, create

informational displays, answer phone calls and field foot traffic. Half of the staff was impacted with personal evacuations. Nancy Gurney and I monitored the Hailey.Recovers.org website along with Danni Edelman, Joe Yelda and Bob Macleod.

- From Friday, Aug. 16th through Monday, Aug. 19th, we monitored the site 24/7. Our staff played a vital role during the fire and served our community well.
- I met with Commissioner Greenburg to give him a virtual tour of the Recovers online site used during the Beaver Creek Fire. He was very supportive of the site and hopes that in the future, it can be accepted and used county wide.

Technology:

• Due to the fire and increased computer usage, the laptops were used for overflow. By offering the two additional laptops, people did not have to wait as long for a computer.

LYNX:

Caldwell Public Library's Board recently named Lacey Welt as the new director for the
Caldwell Public Library. Welt has a degree in English from the University of North Dakota
and her MLIS in Library Science from Florida State. She is currently working on her MBA
in management from the University of Mary. Welt has held several professional librarian
positions in both public and academic libraries, including the Nampa Public Library, the
Fargo Public Library, Stevens-Henager College and the Caldwell Public Library.

Development:

- Due to fire, the monthly meeting of the Magic Valley Library System (MVLS) was moved from Hailey to Twin Falls.
- I continue to work on the strategic plan as the current plan expires in September of this year. This will be an upcoming agenda item for the library board.
- I continue to work with Bob Macleod on the Hometown Teams Smithsonian exhibit. We
 have been looking at Mallory photos to submit and trying to get video clips of sporting
 events from the community. It would be nice if one of our submissions is included in
 the traveling exhibit.

Building:

- I called Sentinel to come and check all of the chirping smoke alarms. The serviceman cleaned them and left. That same afternoon, the fire alarm within the building went off. It could have been coincidental to the service call. There was no fire but it was a good drill for staff. I have completed an evacuation plan similar to the city's plan and will present it to library staff in September. Chief Chapman offered a few suggestions that I have applied.
- The area rugs in the teen area and children's area were cleaned.
