# Letter of Interest

I'm Karen Chen, a dedicated full-time artist. My artistic endeavors span the creation of adult coloring books and vibrant murals, all driven by my core mission: to make art accessible to everyone.

Since 2016, when I introduced my debut adult coloring book, "Life of the Wild," I've continued to produce 13 more coloring books for adults and teens, alongside crafting three mental health guided journals.


My venture into creating coloring books stemmed from personal experience, discovering the therapeutic benefits of coloring for mental well-being. Motivated by this, I've been passionate about sharing these benefits with others, ensuring that everyone has the chance to engage in the creative process.

Beyond coloring books, I also specialize in painting murals that burst with cheerful colors to evoke happiness. Through firsthand experience, I've witnessed the transformative power of involving communities in mural creation. Notably, in one of my projects, over 450 students from Ethel Phillips Elementary came together to paint a 50-foot mural. I've also collaborated with students from continuation and alternative schools, utilizing a paint-by-number technique to ensure accessibility and organization in the mural painting process.

I would love to also offer the Hailey community the same opportunity in Hailey by providing a community paint day, which would allow members of the community to participate in painting the mural. This gives people the opportunity to be involved in public art and to be proud of what we accomplish together.

It's a profound honor for me to leverage my art as a means of directly engaging with and strengthening communities, fostering enduring bonds through shared creative endeavors.

# Work Examples



1 Koi Fish, March 2024, 150 feet x 197 feet, Hsin Kuang Steel Company, Location: Taoyuan, Taiwan

This 13 story mural is a total of 22,550 square feet, making it the largest paint mural in Taiwan. I collaborated with Zach Curtis using my art design. When I created the piece, I had the phrase "nian nian you yu" in mind, which means "May every year end with ample surplus." The fish represents prosperity and abundance. The top of the fish's markings is in the shape of Taiwan, and the dorsal fin represents the beautiful mountains of Taiwan. The fish's tail slowly separates into petals reminiscent of the cherry blossom. Cherry blossoms represent renewal and the cyclical nature of life. They bloom anew each spring, signifying the arrival of a new beginning and the promise of fresh opportunities. I wanted to show how all of life is connected and that through time we are always evolving. Life is about transformation.


# Space Cracks, February 2023, 10'x10', Wide Open Walls, Location: Sacramento:

I painted this mural at Hiram W. Johnson High School. Nine students in this high school assisted me in this painting which can be found in my book Enchanted. I wanted kids to run through the hallway and imagine that there was more behind the walls!





Coyote & Falcon Mascot, Sept 2023, 50'x11', Pro Youth and Families, Location: Sacramento: This mural was painted at Kinney & Prospect School. Over 100 students participated in painting this wall. The two schools mascots, the falcon and coyote were featured in this mural.



**Donut Bumper Car, April 2023, 50' x 12', Marie's Donuts, Location: Sacramento**Marie's Donuts was established in 1957. The back wall had been blank for a very long time. We added a fun bumper donut mural. Look carefully, we even hid an Easter egg for you to find! This Illustration can be



#### Quetzalcoatl, May 2023, 55' x 10', Franklin Blvd District (Clean California Grant), Location: Sacramento:

450 students from Ethel Philips Elementary school helped paint this mural. The mural reflects the school's mascot, the dragon, as well as the cultural diversity of the school. A large number of the students are of Mexican heritage so the mural uses as its dragon a Quetzalcoatl. The mural includes the Mexican national flower, a dahlia, in yellow which represents friendship. I also included a lotus flower from my own Taiwanese heritage. The lotus flower is special in many cultures because it can grow in dirty and muddy water. It reminds us that even when things are difficult, we can still stay kind and strong.

#### Dear Commission members:

As of this year my illustration career of sixty years has been creating projects in a number of subjects from designing the Idaho State University official seal; 21 paintings for the U. S. Air Force Art and Museum Branch at the Pentagon representing individuals; to drawing ski technique for Ski, Skiing, Nastar and other national publications. Large productions include designing all of the stained-glass windows for Our Lady of the Snows Catholic Church on Sun Valley Road working with Hermann Lirk of The Stained Glass Studio and collaborating for 30 years on many other large stained-glass contracts. Over several decades, I have created murals for the Blaine County Museum, the Idaho National Guard at Roberta McKercher Park, along with a Zion Bank mural 8'x 30' in Ketchum to be placed on the south-facing exterior wall at Sun Valley Road and Main Street which will be installed this summer.

In the earliest years of the Sturtevant's ski shop on Sun Valley Road, I would venture in to check out the latest ski fashion, skis, boots, replace the bamboo ski poles I kept braking and chat about the technique of re-applying "Fast Ski" green varnish for the best speed. This new project on the north side of Sturdos will add a visual curiosity inviting further interest to all businesses on Main Street.

Having been born in Hailey with my great-grand father arriving in 1881, I deeply appreciate the Hailey's Arts & Historic Preservation Commission for advancing art projects to enhance and expand tourist participation in the Hailey core.




Wood River High School Mentorship Program History of the Citizens Army 10' x 33'

A few citizens also participated in painting figures.





#### **WeWork Denver**

This 120ft+ mural was designed and installed in 2023 in downtown denver at the Circa Building we work. The visuals were inspired by mountains and city - the lifestyle of living on the front range. The warm and natural colors elevated a concrete outdoor patio, making it warm and inviting.













#### Wild & Scenic Rivers Jackson Hole

This 60ft+ exterior mural was designed and installed in 2021 in downtown Jackson, Wyoming. In collaboration with Jackson Hole Public Art and Dave Hansen Whitewater, the mural celebrates the protected Wild and Scenic rivers of the area and the recreation with vibrant artwork.
