# HAILEY PARKS & LANDS BOARD and PARKS DEPARTMENT 2021 STRATEGIC PLAN

#### Overview

Hailey's Parks & Lands Board was formed in 2002 after developing the "Hailey Parks, Lands & Trails Master Plan, Standards & Guidelines", which was adopted in 2003. The Parks & Lands Board is very goal-oriented, and has completed much of the Action Plan outlined in the Master Plan, while continuing to plan for parks and trails that enhance our community.

#### **Mission Statement**

The Hailey Parks & Lands Board is a group of community volunteers appointed by the Mayor and City Council as advocates for the recreational interests of the citizens of Hailey.

#### **Vision Statement**

We envision Hailey, as we grow and even upon reaching our maximum growth, as a healthy, balanced and connected community where:

Neighborhoods with parks add to the livability of the city.

Neighborhoods are connected and accessible to each other by trails and so maintain the spirit of neighborhood throughout the city as a whole.

Parks, lands and trails are available to serve the widest variety of uses for multigenerational residents – from places of serenity to regional gathering areas.

Revenue generating assets and good stewardship of resources reduce the financial impact on the members of the community.

Parks, lands and trails continue to be a priority as we recognize their importance in creating and supporting the spirit of community in which we all desire to live.

### **Accomplishments**

In the 2010-2014 period, the Parks & Lands Board:

- ✓ Developed Arena Management guidelines for the Hailey Rodeo Park
- ✓ Completed the Fox Demonstration Garden
- ✓ Completed the Roberta McKercher RV Dump Station improvements and installation of restroom
- ✓ Rodeo Arena & Skateboard Park construction
- ✓ Revamped Parks Reservation Policies
- ✓ Irrigation of Curtis & Deerfield Parks with Hiawatha Canal water
- ✓ Worked with a local group for improvements to the Keefer Park Ballfield
- ✓ Partnered with WRLT on grant for Lions Park walkway and bridge

- ✓ Complete Adopt-a-Park Guidelines and have at least three parks adopted for the 2012 season
- ✓ Completed engineering on irrigation of Lions, Hop Porter & Heagle Parks with surface water rights to decrease overall irrigation costs.
- ✓ Develop a complete list of remedial projects for each park to better plan for continued maintenance items.
- ✓ ADD 2014-2020 accomplishments
  - Update the Parks & Trails Master Plan including adding trails and use of alternative weed control methods
  - Finish the plaza area at Keefer Park with a durable surface and elements for children to play on, such as logs and swings.
  - Continue upgrades to Balmoral Park, with signs, plantings, and an immediate fix to the basketball court.
  - Complete Hop Porter Improvements funded by Seagraves Foundation award
  - Replace Deerfield and Foxmoor play structures.
  - Create and distribute Frisbee golf maps.

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#### Lessons Learned from Past Year and Key Strategies for the Coming Year

#### Lessons:

- Parks need to be valued more for their contribution to city livability
- The Master Plan needs to be reviewed and updated more frequently
- In-Lieu fees don't increase the number of parks but do add to amenities
- Development does not assist with rising maintenance costs

#### Key Strategies:

- Better relationship with the Parks Foundation to coordinate efforts
- Push for additional LOT Funding to assist with maintenance costs
- Dedicate Rodeo Grounds fees received above maintenance costs to parks maintenance
- Better control on irrigation costs

#### 2015-2025 Goals

- Develop alternative funding resources.
- Continue to work on greater Hop Porter Park Improvement Plan.
- Address Skate Park Trees
- Research winter park usage ideas —some examples include building ski/boarding, sledding or other alternative feature to expand park usage during the winter.
- Provide parking at Deerfield Park.
- Create historical information and signage for each park.
- Create playground equipment standards.
