TIME TO TURN OFF IRRIGATION!

The amount you pay for wastewater from April 2024 through March 2025 is directly tied to how much water you use in November 2023 through March 2024. The usage after the meter read on 23 October will be part of your bill for November services, so protect it by turning off irrigation on or before October 22nd.

LOCALS ONLY HOUSING

A partnership between the City of Hailey and ARCH Community Housing Trust will provide a new form of deed-restricted housing, only available to locally-employed people and families. Through the program, the City funds a portion of the cost of a market rate home. ARCH uses those funds to pay 20% of the home's purchase price for a qualified buyer, while simultaneously placing a permanent deed-restriction on the home. HPL Has a Shiny New Catalog

HPL is excited to announce the rollout of our new Integrated Library System (ILS) powered by Koha, an open-source system used worldwide. Library patrons will see a noticeable change in the look and function of the online catalog. The user-friendly interface has account maintenance, improved searching capabilities, ready-reference assistance, an app, and much more.

In addition to the systems migration, the library has ended its nearly 25-year membership in the Lynx Library Consortium, a partnership of libraries located mainly in the Boise area. Consortium memberships once offered significant cost savings, but technological advances in recent years have resulted in better, more affordable alternatives. HPL staff are excited about the autonomy and ability to tailor our catalog to better meet our library users' needs.

What hasn't changed is our commitment to prioritize patron requests for old and new titles. New releases within the last year will be purchased, and older items may be requested via our interlibrary loan program with access to libraries around the country. Finally, our partnership with the Community Library in Ketchum will continue uninterrupted - patrons may return their checkouts to either library - whichever is most convenient.

WHAT'S NEW AT KEEFER?

- Field Restoration: The City is working closely with the Hailey Football Club to restore the grass on the soccer field of Keefer Park. The goal of this project is to build a more resilient and durable field for all park users.
- Trailhead Access Parking: A parking area with signage will be formalized at the north end of Keefer Park to access the new BLM trails leading 3.4 miles up the gulch and to Quigley Bike Park.

WHAT CLEARWATER DOES:

Clearwater became the adopter of Keefer Park in 2012, the first year of Hailey's Adopt a Park Program. Hailey is honored to have this legacy relationship with Clearwater on one of our signature parks.



WHAT'S NEW AT LIONS PARK

- Ray Nelson Invitational: Lions Park hosts the annual Ray Nelson Invitational youth baseball tournament, attended by families from across Idaho. In 2023, 28 teams attended the Tournament, packing 65 games into two days. It was the 51st annual Tournament this year.
- Hailey Parks Master Plan: Lions Park is part of a planning process to integrate the "necklace of parks" from downtown Hailey, to Hop Porter, to Lions Park. Lions is celebrated for its extensive natural features and river access.

WOOD RIVER BASEBALL ASSOCIATION

The Wood River Baseball Association (WRBA) has been serving the Wood River Valley youth for decades. It is an organization led by volunteers who have a shared vision of continuing the tradition of baseball in our valley. WRBA believes that sports, and baseball specifically, helps teach the youth of this valley important life lessons, helps them to be better citizens, encourages growth through teamwork and leadership, teaches our kids to compete and persevere through adversity, and lastly to represent the Wood River Valley in a positive way.



WHAT'S NEW AT KIWANIS

- Tree Planting: The City received federal grant funding to plant trees on the west perimeter of Kiwanis park to increase usability of park by providing shade, wind protection, create a sound barrier, and reduce fumes and emissions from highway and airplanes
- Arbor Day Trees: For the past two years, the City has planted trees in honor of Arbor Day at Kiwanis Park

- Grant from INPS provided funding to install 65 plant signs - identifying seven species of trees, eight species of shrubs, twenty-three species of forbs, and ten species of grasses
- A stone bench was installed in memory of long time INPS member, and highly esteemed botanist Carol Blackburn.
 The bench is tucked under two Douglas fir trees, one was donated by Carol herself in 1996
