I wish to recognize our Arts and Historic Preservation Commission this month for their successful installation of the sculpture titled Prosperity Mountain, which honors our Chinese cultural roots here in Hailey. This sculpture. constructed entirely of recycled materials, reflects the old mining and farming equipment we see today, coupled with the Chinese symbol for Prosperity and the character for the Mountain. The artist, Gemma Valdez Daggett, created this piece to reflect the breadth and depth of Hailey's Chinese history. It is part of a series of work, "We are All Immigrants." Many other partners helped bring this piece to fruition. Please stop by the piece on the corner of Main Street near Hailey Coffee Company to see this thoughtful and timely addition to our public art collection.

SOLID WASTE/RECYCLING RATE FEE INCREASE:

Solid waste/ curbside recycling collection rates are increasing effective November 1st and will be reflected on your bill.

The Council approved a commercial and residential solid waste/curbside recycle rate increase based on several key inflationary factors:

- \$2.00/hour average labor cost increase
- \$0.18 increase in fuel costs
- \$72.00/ton to \$75.00/ton increase in tipping fees at Milner Butte Landfill

The city-adopted rates include recycling collection within the base waste collection fee. The recently updated water and wastewater rates can be found here: tinyurl.com/2023feeupdates

RECYCLING & FOOD WASTE DIVERSION

Hailey has partnered with the Environmental Resource Center (ERC) for the past two summers to divert recycling and food waste generated at Hailey events from the landfill. This summer, the ERC collected:

Aluminum: 696.5 lbs.
Plastics (#1-5): 32 lbs.
Glass: 109.25 lbs.
Compost: 300.5 lbs.
Plastic Film: 27 lbs.

DOWNTOWN MASTER PLAN UPDATE

The City of Hailey, in partnership with the Hailey Urban Renewal Agency, is working on a Downtown Master Plan to guide growth, development and public improvements in the downtown area for the next 10-15 years. We have surveyed the public twice, with 388 community responses as well as 68 local businesses.

WINTER PARKING RESTRICTIONS

Winter is upon us! It is time to move campers, cars and other items away from the street. Here are some basic rules:

- No vehicles or personal belongings may be parked within 6' of the asphalt from Nov 1 May 1 from midnight to 7:00AM.
- You are not allowed to move snow from your property into the public street.
- Driveway berms are a fact of winter living in Hailey. You are responsible for your own berm! If this is too much of a task, you may need to pay a private snow contractor to assist you.
- Mailboxes must be 8' back from the pavement. You will need to clear this area yourself for mail delivery.

We tow cars so we can plow the streets at night! This includes River Street, Main Street, downtown side streets and any vehicle within 6' of the pavement in residential neighborhoods. You can sign up for alert reminders about snow removal at: tinyurl.com/snowremovalalert
