DON'T BE TOWED WHEN IT SNOWS!

This winter, the City will be strictly enforcing winter parking restrictions. If you are illegally parked overnight on city streets within 6' of the pavement or in the wrong location in a designated overnight parking area, you will be fined \$40. If your vehicle needs to be relocated due to snow operations, you will be fined an additional \$125.

Towed cars will be brought to one of two locations:

- Temporary Tow Lot: River Street Park and Ride
- Temporary Tow Lot: Countryside and Shenandoah

City-wide parking restrictions are in effect Nov. 1 - May 1 between Midnight and 7:00AM. **Learn more:** tinyurl.com/haileytowingpolicy


Happy New Year! Help pass the winter days at Hailey Public Library, your official winter blues-buster location.




