Hello winter!

As you read this, we are in the midst of, or just past, a large winter storm. My thanks go out to our street crews, fire and police staff who keep us safe and operational as we navigate our winter climate. This month, we have a number of workshops that I hope you will consider attending:

Comprehensive Plan Update Workshop: Join us at the Hailey Planning and Zoning Commission on Monday, February 3rd at 5:30 pm for a workshop on the Comprehensive Plan Update. This plan will guide land use activities for the next ten years in Hailey. Don't worry if you can't make this one, as we will have additional public workshops this spring.

43 Broadford Land Use Planning Workshop: In late 2024 the City purchased a single-family home at 43 Broadford Road. This one-acre property has ample room for future land uses. Options under consideration include additional community housing, or a water division building, which would access from the east via an easement off of Airport Way. Please join us at 5:00 pm on Thursday, February 6th at Hailey City Hall Council Chambers to consider these future land uses.

Neighborhood Parking Discussions: We will bring a guest speaker at 5:00 pm, February 10, at Hailey Town Center West, to lead us through discussions of parking in our neighborhoods. Our speaker, Mayor Jeremy Grimms of Sandpoint, is a land use planner as well as the Mayor of a town facing many similar issues. The meeting will feature a general presentation, small-group discussions and question and answer.

Downtown Master Plan Phase One and Airport Way Transportation Master Plan: I am looking forward to recommendations from our Urban Renewal Agency regarding Phase One of the Downtown Master Plan as well as circulation in the Airport Way area. Their recommendations will include bicycle and pedestrian improvements, wayfinding and road circulation upgrades.

I hope you will join us in community dialogue about these important topics.

HAILEY NEIGHBORHOOD PARKING WORKSHOP

As Hailey continues to grow, effective management of public parking and rights of way have become increasingly important. AIRPORT WAY MASTER PLANNING SURVEY


From learning to escapism, books make for a great Valentine Fall in Love with a Book

Winter Read



The Community Library has selected Four Treasures of the Sky by Jenny Tinghui Zhang, as the Wood River Valley's Winter Read. The Idaho Library Association chose this title as the Idaho Book of the Year in 2023. Four Treasures of the Sky tells the story of a young Chinese girl who is kidnapped and smuggled from China to America. Over the years, she is forced to keep reinventing herself in order to survive and eventually finds herself in a shop tucked away in the Idaho mountains. Based on a real event in Pierce, Idaho, Zhang captures the essence of a young woman determined to find her independence in a

hostile and strange new country. Book discussions are planned in February at each of the valley libraries including Stanley. Hailey's event is Saturday, February 22 at 11 AM. Black History Month Book Display

We're celebrating Black History Month with a special display to remember important people and events in the history of the African diaspora. On display are books that honor Black people from the beginning of U.S. history, from the enslaved people first brought over from Africa in the early 17th century to African Americans living in the United States today.

More exciting enhancements coming to the Library

Since the pandemic, HPL has undergone extensive remodeling to accommodate the shift in library use. The result has been many improvements including public restrooms, a designated teen room, private meeting, work, and study spaces, test proctoring services, public work spaces, telehealth equipment, an expanded children's area with a maker space, and the acquisition of Town Center West (TCW) for programming and community use.



The finishing touches of the remodel project in TCW were completed in January. New carpet, paint, lighting, audio/visual equipment, restrooms, and a kitchenette area has transformed the space into an inviting option for programming and public events. You may see uptick in similar upgrades happening in the library. With grant funding from several sources, the installation of new shelving, work pods, and a new computer area are underway.
