COMPREHENSIVE PLAN PUBLIC HEARING

City Council will discuss the Final Draft of Hailey's Comprehensive Plan Update on Monday, May 12, 2025. The Comprehensive Plan is used to guide long-range planning efforts, assist in the review of development proposals, and support other activities that shape the built and natural environments in the heart of the Wood River Valley.

The plan further serves as guide for all other planning efforts and policy development in the city, providing a road map to shape area-wide and neighborhood-scale plans. It considers the importance of the natural setting, population, housing, and economic patterns as well as the unique character and quality of life that provides a sense of place and cultural identity.

SEWER RATES ADJUSTED

Every April, the City recalculates all utility rates for the next twelve months. We calculate the average winter water usage based on the previous five months (November through March) and use that amount to set the corresponding rate according to the current wastewater rate table adopted by City Council. Wastewater rates include your usage as well as a monthly bond payment which is set to cover the indebtedness the city has on treatment plant improvements as formerly approved by voters. This annual process results in some utility bills going up, some may stay unchanged, and some may decrease from the previous year.
